ACADEMIC AND ADMINISTRATIVE POLICY
ENROLLMENT REQUIREMENTS 2025-2026

Policy: Based on the cohort the student chooses, the following must be completed prior to beginning the First Year Nursing courses:

UNIVERSITY OF DELAWARE (UD) STUDENTS

The MHRSON defines passing as a course grade of a C- or better for University of Delaware pre-requisites, with a minimum GPA of 2.0.

1. The Preadmission ATI Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS)
 - Exempt GPA 2.0 with twelve (12) credits and at least one (1) Science course
2. College courses with a passing grade:
 - Human Anatomy (NURS 101)* or Fundamentals of Anatomy & Physiology I (KAAP 220)*
 - Human Physiology (BISC 276)* or Fundamentals of Anatomy & Physiology II (KAAP 221)*

***These courses must have been taken within five years of the student's August enrollment.**

 - Medical Microbiology (MMSC 270)
 - Critical Reading and Writing (ENGL 110)
 - College Math and Statistics (MATH 114)
 - Introduction to Sociology (SOCI 201)
 - General Psychology (PSYC 100)
 - Life Span Development (HDFS 201)
 - Language of Medicine (MMSC 200)

DTCC/TRANSFER COHORT

1. The ATI Preadmission Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS)
 - A score of **63%** or greater is required. Only one testing opportunity is provided for the student to meet this benchmark.
 - Fourteen (14) college credits must be completed before taking the ATI TEAS test.
 - The ATI TEAS test must be taken prior to April 1st of the planned August enrollment.
2. College courses with a C- or better:
 - Anatomy & Physiology I
 - Anatomy & Physiology II

These courses must have been taken within five years of the student's August enrollment.

College courses with a C- or better (no time limit):

- English Composition
- Microbiology
- College Math and Statistics, Math for Health Sciences, or Quantitative Reasoning
- Sociology
- General Psychology
- Human Development
- Medical Terminology

All college courses must be completed prior to the August enrollment.

Any exception(s) to this policy must be approved by the Faculty Organization.

It is the student's responsibility to ensure that they complete all the enrollment requirements.
